September 2021, PangeaSeed Foundation's global Sea Walls: Artists for Oceans program created 19 ocean conservation themed murals in Santa Cruz. Completed in a week with over 25 artists from Santa Cruz, California, and across the nation.

The large-scale artworks speak to locally relevant, pressing marine environmental issues such as plastic pollution, ocean acidification, warming seas, local biodiversity loss, environmental justice, and more.

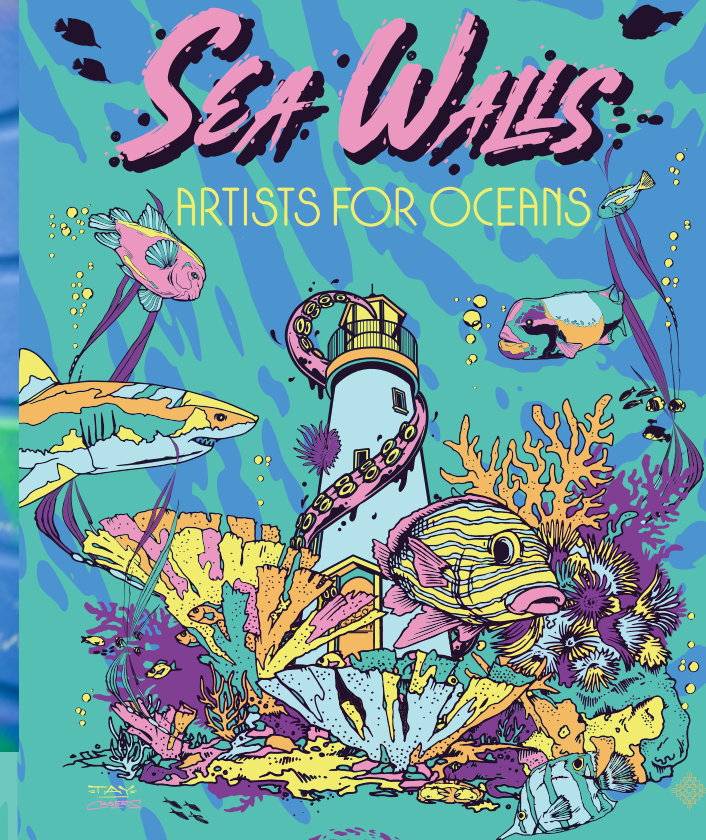

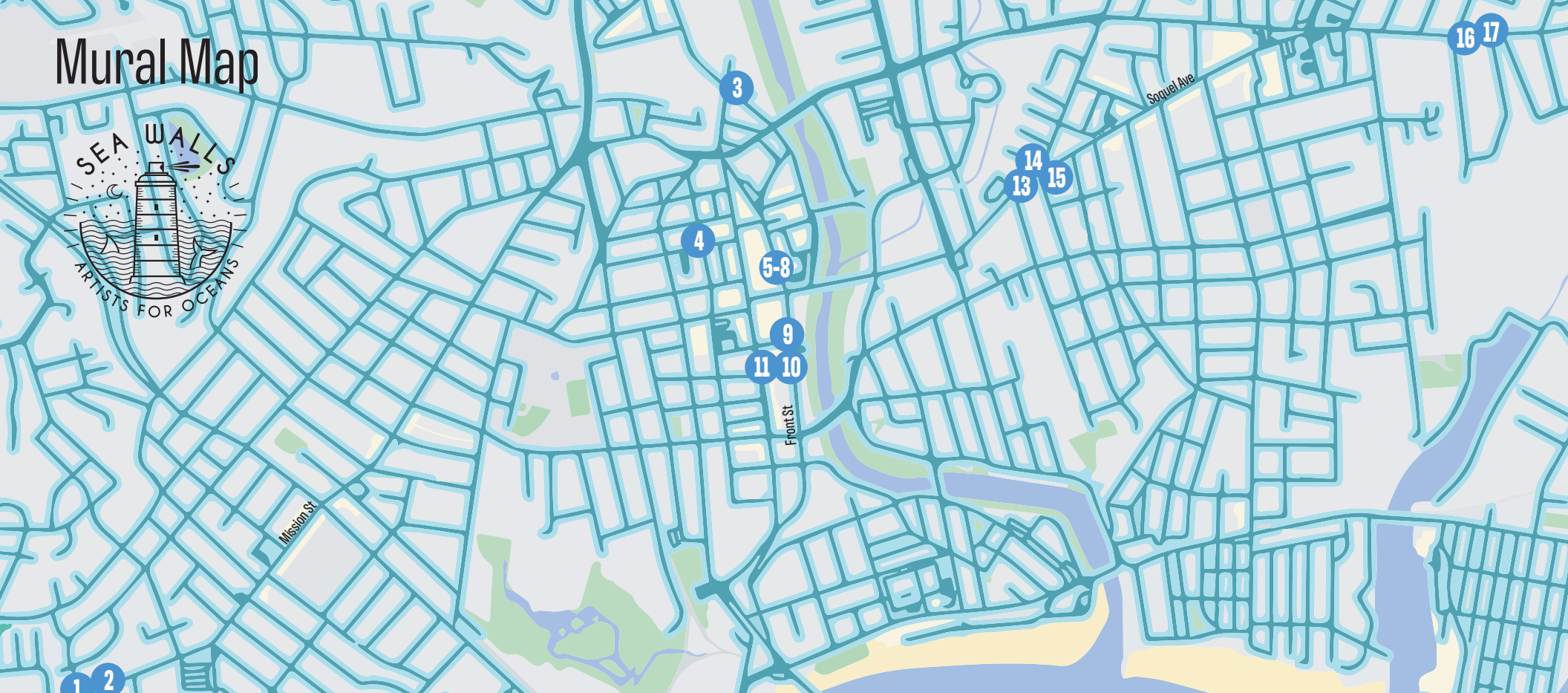
